Jimmy Buffett at Jones Beach - Saturday, July 1, 2006

TICKET DETAILS

Jimmy Buffett has kept his word and will be performing at Jones Beach once again. Here's what you need in order to get those "Fun Tickets in your pockets"...

First off, remember concert tickets are a "perk". They are not distributed as a matter of "right". Just belonging to the METRO Parrot Head Club doesn't mean you qualify for tickets.

Our Club earns tickets through membership in Parrot Heads in Paradise by doing community service and you, in turn, have to earn them by participating in Club Community Service Activities. It's really the only rule that we have. Well, that and not causing the police to be called to a Club event.

If you are not sure if you qualify, mail in a ticket request anyway. If you can make it to a community service event, we may be able to accommodate you. If you can't, we'll return the check to you in the self-addressed, stamped envelope that you sent.

On Saturday February 18 , a "Club Bidness" meeting took place prior to the monthly Long Island Happy Hour at Zoinks. During the spirited round table discussion, (well, it was a rectangular table but the discussion was spirited nonetheless) the following items were debated:

Feedback on Frosted Party 2/11/06 - Would love to see Jimmy & The Parrots again, also suggested Jim Morris, Changes in Latitudes. Price of \$65 per person fine- no higher than \$75.00..... Only complaint with the Hilton was the bartender (not very nice). Also no Frozen Drinks were available.

MOTM - Committee should be formed for daily meetings and activities for those who want to participate. Cell phone list should also be given out for people to contact each other while attending the meeting. Send Club basket again for raffling. Shirts should be done... some club members have access to vendor that will do limited numbers of shirts.

Elected or Appointed Officers - In the official PHIP (Parrot Heads in Paradise) bylaws each club can do what they prefer- appoint or elect officials. Also no term limits. Discussed pro's and con's of appointing vs. electing.

Who's The Blonde Stranger - No one likes to be the new kid on the block. To avoid clicks and people feeling left out- Suggestions were Memberships cards with yearly renewal (or new) fees..... White Leis given out at Happy hours (people can wear them at Happy Hours till comfortable with the group).....membership badges to wear to club events.

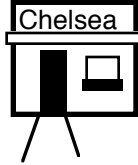

That got your attention...now get your minds out of the gutter.

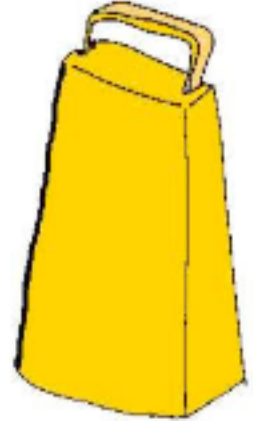
As **Al Straaik** noted in his article on page one, Jimmy Buffett has decided to let get rid of the Coral Reefer Band's horn section for this year's summer tour.
